# Reconfirm instructional delivery method: See below

Reconfirm how instruction will be delivered for each grade level:

Pre-Kindergarten: In-person with safety protocols

Elementary (Grades Y5 - 6): Home-based (full Virtual) for students and parents who selected this option. Homeroom (Hybrid) for students and parents who selected this option.

Middle School (Grades 7 - 8): All students remain virtual until the rate of daily infections decline and the infection rate declines. Once this occurs, within 1 week, building begins to phase in the Homeroom (Hybrid) students and continues to offer full online for virtual (Homebased) students.

High School (Grades 9 - 12): All students remain virtual until the rate of daily infections declines and the infection rate declines. Once this occurs, building begins to phase in the Homeroom (Hybrid) students and continues to offer full online for virtual (Homebased) students.

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

DCS has continued to increase the in-person services for special education students (per IEPs), ELL students and other special populations.
