For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.



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Creekside Intermediate School continues to provide a well-rounded education focusing on the needs of each student. Students showed progress in Mathematics, English Language Arts and Social Studies. Our focus on project based learning and personalized instruction will continue to support our students in the future.

1. Creekside Intermediate School houses all 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students in Dexter Community Schools.
2. Creekside continues to make progress on our school improvement plans. We are currently working on Writers and Readers Workshop. Our school improvement plan is aligned with the district's strategic plan.
3. Creekside provides the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade education to over 550 students.

5. Creekside continues to support students so they will move into the Avg, HiAvg and Hi categories based on growth.
