Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for Creekside Intermediate School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given. Creekside Intermediate School has not been given one of these labels.

- Because our district is organized in a campus, all students in grades 5 and 6 are assigned to Creekside Intermediate School.
- Our school improvement plan is aligned with the district's strategic plan and includes goals to improve all students' reading, writing, science, and social studies proficiency.
- Creekside Intermediate School's curriculum is aligned to the Common Core State Standards, which can be found at <http://www.corestandards.org/>.
- Creekside Intermediate School assessed its students with many tools. One local tool that we use is NWEA. Our NWEA data shows that Creekside students are performing above the national norms in most areas.
